Youth and Philanthropy Initiative

Overview

This assignment will require you to:

- 1. Look into a number of charities and choose <u>one</u> that you or your group believes is important; then research this charity in depth:
 - a. What is their purpose / mission? When, how, and by whom was it founded? Who are the staff and/or volunteers? How is it funded?
 - b. What kind of contribution do they make to the community? What services do they provide to the community? Why is this contribution important?
 - c. What, in particular, led your group to choose this charity? What made it stand out from the rest, and why do you believe in it? Provide at least one example of a person or family this charity has helped. What would the charity do with the \$5000 grant?
- 2. Present the above information to the class using power point as the foundation for your presentation. You may choose to incorporate other presentation forms as well (video clips, acting/drama, photography, personal interviews with beneficiaries of the charity, etc.)

*The top team in each CLE 10 class will go on to the finals and compete for the \$5000 grant.

Group guidelines

- Select a well-rounded group of 2-3 people (or you can do the assignment on your own)
- Choose a team leader to coordinate group planning and meetings outside of class
- Use collaborative decision-making
- Ensure equal distribution of responsibilities (each team member researches, prepares for the power point for, and presents A, B, or C as listed above)
 - o Each individual will be evaluated on their power point and presentation.

Research guidelines

- Research a number of different charities and narrow down your choices to 3.
- Collectively decide on the one you want to support.
- To qualify for the \$5000 grant, it <u>must</u> be a **local / grassroots / community-based <u>registered</u> <u>charity</u> in the social service sector (people helping people).** You will need to obtain the registered charity # at <u>www.cra-arc.gc.ca/charities</u>). You will also need to set up, prepare for and conduct an interview. If appropriate, request a tour of the facilities and/or to meet the beneficiaries (you may also request permission to take photos and/or video footage)
- If you choose not to compete for the \$5,000 grant, you can research any charity it can be a national or international charity, and you do not need to conduct an interview.

Presentation guidelines

- 10 minute power point presentation (see evaluation rubric on the back of this page)
- You may use other presentation tools as well if you like (for example, you might create a video and embed it in your power point, although it <u>must</u> be your own original creation i.e., you cannot use a video that was created by the charity or someone else)
- All members will create and present their own power point
- Group presentations to take place two weeks before spring break
- Finalists to present to a panel of judges the week before spring break
